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FSU to Host MLK Celebration Maryland's Lieutenant Governor, FSU Students Featured

In memory of the life and achievements of Martin Luther King Jr., FSU will hold its annual MLK Celebration, featuring keynote speaker Anthony G. Brown, lieutenant governor of Maryland, with musical performances and student speakers offering inspirational stories. The event will be held at 7:30 p.m. on **Thursday, April 15**, in PAC Pealer Recital Hall.

These student stories, with Brown's reflections, will be a powerful and stirring tribute to Dr. King. It is also an opportunity for everyone, especially student groups and organizations, to come show their admiration for the life and contributions of this great civil rights leader.

Brown is a Harvard-educated attorney and has been a member of the Active and Reserve Components of the United States Army since 1984. He was



inaugurated as Maryland's eighth lieutenant governor on Jan. 17, 2007. He is a former chair of the Prince George's Community College Board of Trustees and has traveled the state visiting community colleges and opening a dialogue with students and administrators alike.

Recycling Improves Over 3-Year Period

On recent completion of the national Recyclemania competition for a third straight year, FSU announces strong improvement in numerous recycling categories since participation in the competition began in 2008. Recyclemania is a friendly competition among colleges and universities to see who can reduce and recycle the most on-campus waste. The competition begins every spring in late January and runs for 10 weeks until early April. During this time, colleges submit weekly weights for recycled goods and municipal waste to be included in overall rankings. FSU uses Recyclemania data to provide an overall snapshot of recycling efforts on campus and can report a steady increase in recycling over three years in many categories. FSU has seen the strongest increase in the collection of paper, cardboard and glass during the three-year period. In 2010, FSU collected 137,000 lbs of paper, compared to 22,500 lbs in 2008. Thanks in part to efforts by the recycling staff, Aramark and the FSU Bookstore, cardboard collection totals increased from 8,000 lbs in 2008 to 42,500 lbs in 2010. With the addition of over 30 “glass” recycling bins in 2009, the collection totals for glass jumped from 3,400 lbs in 2009 to over 19,000 lbs in 2010. These improvements were possible because of the dedication of FSU’s recycling coordinator, **Erick**

Kasekamp, and his support staff. According to Kasekamp, the increase in 2010 was due in part to increased availability of bins and awareness of the program. For info, contact Kasekamp at eskasekamp@frostburg.edu.
