‘Godspell’ Celebrates Life of Jesus

Theatre and Dance at FSU will present “Godspell,” a rock musical celebration of the life and teachings of Jesus, featuring alum **Ryan Bowie** in the title role and live music from members of the Beat Street All Stars.

Performances will take place in the Performing Arts Center **April 16 and 17** and **April 22 through 24** at 7:30 p.m., with matinee performances **April 17 and 24** at 2 p.m.

“Godspell,” taken from an ancient word for “Gospel,” is one of the most successful musicals in theatre history. Based on John-Michael Tebelak’s book highlighting the teachings of St. Matthew, the musical features a lively score by Stephen Schwartz with updated arrangements, and boasts a

string of familiar songs, including “Day by Day,” that bring the parables of Jesus to contemporary life.

Drawing from theatrical traditions of clowning, magic, pantomime, charades, acrobatics and Vaudeville, “Godspell” continues to attract audiences today.

FSU Theatre and Music alum Ryan Bowie has returned to choreograph “Godspell,” in addition to playing the title role of Jesus. A full-time actor in New York City, Bowie recently appeared in the New York premiere of “Dotty Dot,” a new children’s musical, as well as “My Fair Lady,” “Sorry! Wrong Chimney!” and “High School Musical” at Maples Repertory Theatre.

Kennedy Awarded FSUF Pinnacle

The FSU Foundation, Inc., has honored **Ken Kennedy** of Frostburg with the Pinnacle Award, its highest honor, in recognition of the nearly

quarter-century of expert guidance and time he has offered to the Foundation.

Kennedy, only the sixth person to receive the award, is retired from Westvaco (now NewPage). He is the current treasurer of the Foundation Board of Directors, serving in that role since 1989, and he served on the board for many years before that.

The award was granted during FSU’s Sloop Leadership Institute, named for the late FSU professor Richard Sloop, held at Bedford Springs Resort on March 26.

“Ken’s years of service have helped to provide a bright future for FSU and his consistent unrestricted giving to the Annual Fund helps the University fund its most critical and immediate needs,” said Sam Griffith, president of the FSU Foundation Board of Directors. “It seems particularly fitting to honor him this evening in conjunction with

the Sloop Leadership Institute. Like Dick Sloop, Ken is a principled leader, concerned about the common good and the welfare of our students.”

Kennedy retired in 1989 from Westvaco’s Luke Mill after 37 years of service. At the time of his retirement, he served as Expansion Program coordinator. He earned a Master of Science in Management degree from FSU in 1972.

Created in 1993, the Pinnacle Award recognizes individuals who have made significant contributions of time, talent or treasures in support of the educational mission of FSU through the FSU Foundation. Previous recipients are Ralph Race, Lillian Wellner, Al Boxley, Walter Hedrick and Leonard Schwab.

Philosophical Lecture



The Philosophy Department presents its Spring 2010 Philosophical Forum lecture to be held **Tuesday, April 6**, at 7 p.m. in Dunkle 218. The lecture, entitled "The

Puzzle of Divine Forgiveness," will feature guest speaker Dr. Sharon Ryan, associate professor of philosophy and chairperson of the department at the University of West Virginia, Morgantown. The presentation will be followed by a discussion.

Divine forgiveness is an important element in monotheistic religions, such as Judaism, Christianity and Islam. Ryan will reflect on the apparent contradiction between the belief in divine forgiveness and the belief in divine perfection. To admit that God, the eternal and perfect being, can forgive would seem to imply that the "spirit" or "mind" of God is subject to evolution or development in the same way as human consciousness. The presenter will discuss this puzzle as well as some possible solutions.

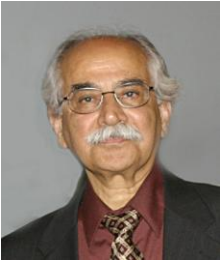
