Lee Gutkind Reading

FSU and the Frostburg Center for Creative Writing will host nonfiction writer Lee Gutkind **Thursday, Nov. 17**, at 7:30 p.m. at the Lyric Theater, 22 E. Main St., in Frostburg. The reading is free and open to the public.

Gutkind has been called “the Godfather of creative nonfiction” by Vanity Fair and has written and edited over 20 books of nonfiction, including two memoirs, “Forever Fat: Essays by the Godfather” and “Truckin’ With Sam.” Creative Nonfiction, a magazine he founded, is the first and largest magazine that exclusively publishes creative nonfiction. He is also writer-in-residence at the Consortium for Science and Policy and Outcomes, as well as a professor at the Hugh Downs School of Human Communication at Arizona State University. Gutkind has traveled the world, giving lectures about various topics such as child psychology, pediatrics, personalized medicine, baseball and the world-wide storytelling expansion.

‘Islam in Focus’

The American Institute for Yemeni Studies will present “Islam in Focus: Contemporary Religion and Political Movements in North Africa and the Middle East,” a day of lectures and discussion on contemporary Islam, on **Wednesday, Nov. 30**, from 9 a.m. to 4 p.m. in the Lane Atkinson Room (232). The symposium will provide an introduction to contemporary expressions of Islam, of culture in Muslim societies and of the politics of contemporary Islamic movements.

Three scholars of the Muslim world will present topics on religion and religion’s relationship to politics from the contemporary Muslim world. Following each presentation, the entire panel will engage in an open discussion about Islam, Islamic politics and political movements. Dr. Charles Schmitz from the American Institute for Yemeni Studies will open the symposium at 9 a.m. with an overview of the institute and the services it offers scholars of Yemen today.

The first presentation by Abdulla Hamidaddin at 9:30 a.m. will address religion and its relationship to politics

and society in Saudi Arabia.

Hamidaddin is a native of Saudi Arabia and a doctoral candidate at King’s College in the U.K. He has been in close interaction with the staff of the Embassy of the United States in Saudi Arabia and has lectured at the Foreign Service Institute of the U.S. State Department in Washington, D.C.

At 12:30 p.m., Dr. Anouar Boukhars from McDaniel College in Westminster, Md., will speak about contemporary Islamic political movements. Boukhars will speak about the evolution of the Muslim Brotherhood’s politics in Egypt over the 20th century and in the contemporary context of the Arab Spring. Boukhars, from Morocco, is a specialist in Middle Eastern politics, international relations and security issues.

At 2:30 p.m., Schmitz will speak about contemporary Islam in Yemen, emphasizing the diversity of political forms of Islam and the rapid transformation of religious expression. He will pay particular attention to the wide-ranging debates among Muslim scholars about proper Muslim approaches to politics in modern life.

Center for Creative Writing to Host Community Workshops

The Frostburg Center for Creative Writing, in partnership with the Allegany County Library System, ACT Personnel Service and A STAR! AmeriCorps, will host two five-week creative writing workshops at the Frostburg Public Library. There will be one series of workshops for elementary school students and one for high school students. They are free and open to all elementary and high school students.

The workshops will take place every Tuesday, **from Nov. 15 through Dec. 13**. Workshops will meet in the Toll House Room and the Library Meeting Room of the Main Street library from 4 to 6 p.m. The elementary school workshop will be taught by local poet Nina Forsythe, and the high school workshop will be taught by FSU graduate **Darcy Gagnon**.

The purpose is to get students excited about writing and to provide an atmosphere that cultivates curiosity and creativity. Each workshop will combine lessons on poetry or fiction with writing exercises. 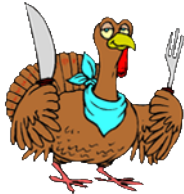
