### **FSU Announces Award for Associate Degree Holders**

### \$1,250 Per Semester Available for Students With 3.0 GPAs

Graduates of Maryland community colleges may now be able to attend FSU at a significant discount, following the establishment of the FSU Associate Degree Scholars Award.

The award is available to students who graduated from any Maryland community college, as well as Potomac State College of West Virginia University, with an Associate of Arts, Associate of Science or Associate of Arts in Teaching degree with a cumulative 3.0 grade point average. Certain Associate of Applied Science degrees may qualify as well.

The award is worth \$1,250 per semester and will be awarded for a

total of four semesters if the student enrolls full-time and maintains a 3.0 GPA.

The aim of the award is to bring the tuition costs for a student's final two years of a bachelor's degree closer to that of a community college. For Maryland students, that would translate to a 47 percent discount from FSU's 2011-2012 in-state tuition rate of \$2,652 per semester. For out-ofstate students, it would be a 16 percent discount over the out-of-state rates, except for those in contiguous counties (Somerset, Bedford, Fulton, Franklin and Adams counties in Pennsylvania; Grant, Mineral, Hampshire, Morgan, Berkeley and Jefferson counties in West Virginia; and Loudoun County in Virginia),

where students already receive discounted tuition; this award would provide a 22 percent discount over the contiguous county rate.

Students should still apply for all applicable scholarships and grants and complete the Free Application for Federal Student Aid (FAFSA) by March 1 of every year to help cover the remaining educational costs. For students with significant financial need, additional financial aid opportunities may be available as well, including scholarships through the FSU Foundation.

# **CES Presents the Paul Taylor Dance Company**

The masterful choreography of an American legend comes to FSU when FSU's Cultural Events Series presents the Paul Taylor Dance Company on **Tuesday, Oct. 11**, at 7:30 p.m. in the PAC Drama Theatre. Ticket holders will also have the opportunity to interact with company members in a postperformance discussion.

The 16-member company will perform three works from the Taylor repertory. "Oh, You Kid!" is an exuberant throwback to the days of vaudeville set to the music of the Paragon Ragtime Ensemble. "Mercuric Tidings" is an energetically joyful work set to the music of Schubert, while the darkly beautiful "Lines of Loss," featuring the music of six composers, sets a more sorrowful mood.

Taylor, one of the most revered American choreographers of the 20th and 21st centuries, helped to forge America's indigenous art form: modern dance. At age 81, Taylor continues to win praise for the vitality of his recent works as well as his classics. Since its inception over 50 years ago, the Paul Taylor Dance Company has become a celebrated and prominent member of the international dance community.

In support of the public performance, a free Arts for Enrichment event will be offered to community members. On Monday, Oct. 10, students of dance will have the opportunity to take a master class with one of the Paul Taylor company members. The class in modern dance technique is suitable for late beginner or early intermediate-level dance students. Space is limited and reservations are required. # Display at Ort

Barbara A. Meyers, daughter of George A. Meyers, recently presented the Lewis J. Ort Library with 48 works of art from her private collection. She retired this past year from a distinguished career as an elementary school principal in Baltimore County. Many of the pieces of art were collected from her world travels with her mother and father. She has been a strong supporter of the George A. Meyers Collection and has donated an outstanding book collection, many titles autographed by the authors, and several very rare items. All these materials became part of the collection.

The exhibit items from the collection will be on view on the

fourth floor of the Ort Library, starting Oct. 10 and continuing for two months. There are also three display cases exhibiting many original art works from around the world.

George A. Meyers was a labor secretary of the Communist Party U.S.A. as well as a union organizer and served as president of the Maryland AFLCIO. He grew up in Lonaconing, Md., and his grandfather was part of the community of coal miners whose nickels and dimes built the foundation for what eventually became FSU. He worked in the Celanese Corp. of America textile plant and was instrumental in organizing the Textile Workers' Union of America local in 1935. Before his death in 1999, he

visited the University monthly, sharing materials with the library for the collection. The collection, which was first displayed to the public at the Ort Library in October 1997, includes nearly 15,000 books on Marxism, Leninism, communism, socialism, labor, unions, women's rights and U.S. civil rights.

## **FSU Hosts Provocative Traveling Exhibit**

A traveling exhibition of Ferris State University's Jim Crow Museum of Racist Memorabilia will be at FSU's Stephanie Ann Roper Gallery from Oct. 21 through Nov. 9. The opening reception is scheduled for Friday, Oct. 21, from 7 to 9 p.m. in conjunction with FSU's Homecoming and Leadership Weekend.

"Hateful Things," a sampling from the Museum's 4,000 pieces, represents nearly 150 years of anti-black, racist objects and images. It addresses the relationship between Jim Crow segregation and everyday objects that belittle African-Americans. Examples vary from Jim Crow memorabilia to caricatured images of blacks on postcards, games, ashtrays and drinking glasses.

Admission is free. The gallery is open Sunday through Wednesday from 1 to 4 p.m.

The exhibit is made possible by a Catherine R. Gira Campus-to-Community Grant, FSU's Black Student Alliance, the President's Council on Diversity, the Diversity Center, the support of numerous FSU academic departments and an Allegany Arts Council Special Project Grant.

## Free Bio-medical Screenings!

FSU's popular student health and wellness initiative is hosting another round of annual bio-medical screenings this fall. Creating Healthy, Informed, Lasting Lifestyles (CHILL) will ask students to participant in their biomedical screenings **Thursday, Oct. 13**, from 8 a.m. to noon each day in the Lane Atkinson Room (232). Students will be able to have their blood pressure, body mass index, body composition, blood sugar and cholesterol levels checked at no cost, all while earning CHILL prizes.

To complete the screening, students will need to refrain from eating or drinking anything but water for at least eight hours before the screening. The screenings involve having a vial of blood drawn to check the blood sugar and cholesterol levels.

Each student screened will be eligible to receive follow-up care at Brady Health Center, including free consultations with nursing staff and the CHILL dietician.

In exchange for the student's time, each participant will receive a complimentary breakfast and a free CHILL T-shirt, and will be entered in drawings for other free CHILL prizes. The first 25 students in line each morning for the screenings will also receive a special bonus CHILL prize.

To be eligible for the screening, students must be at least 18 and not have any previous diagnosis concerning their blood sugar or heart health. Students who do not qualify for this screening are encouraged to contact Brady Health Center to make an appointment to have the screening performed at a later date.
