## Celtic Crossroads – A St. Patrick’s Treat at FSU

FSU’s Cultural Events Series presents Celtic Crossroads, doing to Irish music what Riverdance has done to Irish dance, on **Sunday, March 13**, at 7:30 p.m. Because of the show’s popularity, this performance has been moved from FSU’s Pealer Recital Hall to the larger venue of The Stage at Mountain Ridge High School in Frostburg.

The name Celtic Crossroads originates from a time in Ireland when neighboring communities met at the crossroads between towns and villages to socialize. With a focus on keeping the tradition of Irish music alive, each Celtic Crossroads performer nurtures this bygone concept, but steers this tradition into the 21st century. True high-kicking from some of Ireland’s best-respected Irish dancers intensifies the pulsating rhythms of the show.



The show features seven world-class musicians playing over 20 instruments. From start to finish, the audience will be captivated by a fusion of musical varieties in the Irish music genres, such as Eastern European Gypsy, American bluegrass, world classical, jazz and various forms of Celtic music.

Magical interludes from the haunting uilleann pipes, whistles, low whistles and, of course, the Irish harp, along with some of Ireland’s finest

examples of traditional song, transport the audience to those crossroads in Ireland. Tempestuous fiddle playing competes with explosive banjo, intricate mandolin, accordion, mandola, bouzouki and guitar riffs, while silky flute playing reminds the audience that these traditional musicians are also classically trained. Throw in thunderous bodhran rhythms, drum kit and Peruvian cajon, along with Irish dancers, and the audience will find themselves clapping to the rhythm.

## FSU to Participate in ‘Enough Is Enough’

### Campaign Aims to Stem Violence



FSU will participate in the campaign to bring an end to school and campus violence, “Enough Is Enough,” **Monday, April 4, through Saturday, April 9**. Each day has a theme, and events, workshops and information will be offered.

Monday is kickoff day, starting with the annual Martin Luther King Celebration in the afternoon in the Lane Atkinson Room (232). It will be followed by a rally, march and the unveiling of the Lane Center waterfall. That evening, also in the Atkinson Room, there will be a talk by Dustin Lance Black, screenwriter of the movie “Milk.”

Tuesday is Take the Pledge Day, in which members of the campus community can sign a pledge to take a

stand against violence. Also on Tuesday will be the first of a series of brown bag lunches, “Conflict Resolution,” offered by **Dr. Elesha Ruminski** and her students at noon in the new Lane South Addition, which will also serve as headquarters for Enough Is Enough week. That evening, **President Jonathan Gibraltar** and **Dr. Tom Bowling** will hold a Blog from the ‘BURG online chat on civility. The evening workshop that follows will be on cyber-bullying.

Wednesday, Unity Day, will feature a brown bag session on “Spirituality of Forgiveness,” offered by UCM’s **Rev. Cindy Zirlott**, followed by an evening workshop on healthy relationships offered by the Family Crisis Resource Center. Everyone will also be encouraged to leave a handprint on a These Hands Don’t Hurt banner, which will then hang from the Lane Center second-floor railing for the rest of the week.

Thursday will be Take Action Day. In addition to an opportunity for students to create posters that will be

displayed in the Lane Center, international fitness and wellness guru Scott Cole will return to campus to offer an evening workshop called “Get Crazy, Get Still.”

On Friday, for Beats of Peace Day, members of the campus community will be encouraged to share random acts of kindness. These statements will be turned into a rotating PowerPoint slideshow that will be visible from many locations. Cole will also return for a daytime workshop, and Late Night in the LUC will feature fun activities reflecting the week’s themes.

Saturday is Campus Cares Day with campuswide community service. There will also be an all-day National Coalition Building Institute workshop.

### 'EmPOWER Maryland'



FSU will display the interactive exhibit "EmPOWER Maryland: You Owe It to Yourself" in the lobby of the Lane University Center **through March 18**. The exhibit is provided by the Maryland Energy Administration and gives users the opportunity to learn how to save money and conserve energy.

As participants move through the display, they are given a worksheet to check energy-saving behaviors they already engage in and behaviors they are willing to try. ### FSU to Present 'Dreadful Memories'

FSU will celebrate International Women's Day by presenting a screening of the film "Dreadful Memories: The Life of Sarah Ogan Gunning" from 6 to 8 p.m. on **Tuesday, March 8**, in Compton 226. This event is free and open to the public.



Gunning suffered a life of bitter poverty as one of 11 children raised in Appalachia. She was the daughter of a mining family when wages for miners were only \$1.44 for 10-hour work days. Her suffering became the inspiration for dozens of songs about working people, the mines and the great coal strikes of the 1920s and 1930s. Her songs gave a voice to the crowds at labor rallies, and she was influential in labor organizing.

**Dr. Greg Wood**, from the FSU History Department, will provide a brief presentation on women and labor organizing before the screening.

Amanda is Laura's mother and a former Southern belle, who, since her husband left her, has been obsessed with finding an appropriate "gentleman caller" for her fragile daughter. The overbearing mother elicits the help of her irresponsible, dreamer son in hopes of making her own dreams come true.

## Honors Students Present to Council

First-year FSU Honors Program students, **Jerica Bennett, Aaron Blough, Katie Dignan, Franklin Taylor** and **Nicole Wilson** presented a panel on “Using Simulations in Honors Classes” at the Maryland Collegiate Honors Council’s annual meetings at St. Mary’s College on March 4 and 5.

The panel conducted a brief re-enactment of an original simulation designed by two Honors Program sophomores, **Max Green** and **Gavin Riley**, and discussed the pros and cons of classroom simulations. The simulation fictionalized the Arizona Immigration law controversy and included over two dozen roles from the head of the state’s ACLU to border patrol guards. After the testimonies, a judiciary council voted on the legitimacy of the immigration law.

### FSU Helps Growth of Green Workforce

#### Wind and Solar Energy Certified Education Program



FSU will offer the WISE (Wind and Solar Energy) Education Program on design, installation and maintenance of residential wind and solar (PV) electric generation systems. The program includes an online component (**March 21 through May 12**) as well as hands-on training (**May 13 through May 15**) to prepare attendees for the certification test administered by the North American Board of Certified Energy Practitioners. The hands-on part of the program will be held in Compton Science Center.

Participants will learn the basics of PV/wind systems, resource assessment, setup configuration and regulations

related to PV and wind generation system installations. Attendees are also given information about codes, regulations, standards and financial incentives regarding renewable energy systems. The FSU engineering labs and WISE system on campus will be available for practical experiments and demonstrations.

Through the eight-week, self-guided online instruction, attendees learn basic technology, design methods, codes and safety requirements. The online modules can be accessed throughout the program to allow participants to work at their own pace.

The on-site workshop offers an intensive introduction to the practice of installing wind and solar energy systems. Participants install a small grid-connected PV system and attend labs where they learn about wind generation systems.

FSU will accept applications through **March 13**. Space is limited and enrollment is on a first-come, first-served basis. The only requirement is a high school diploma.

Most participants come into the program hoping to enter into the energy field and others want to use residential installation as a way to enhance their current position. While many of the participants are contractors, the program attracts other occupations as well. Entrepreneurs interested in starting small businesses in the renewable energy field, homeowners who want to generate their own electricity and non-technical professionals such as real estate agents, lawyers, financial consultants and teachers have attended the previous sessions.
