FSU's Department of Music will present its Opera Theatre performance, "An Aria in the Spring," directed by **Mariana Mihai-Zoeter** and accompanied by **Dr. Sean Beachy** on **Friday, April 13**, at 8 p.m.

Come see music come to life from favorite operas such as "Vanessa" by Samuel Barber; "Tosca" and "La Boheme" by Puccini; "Cosi Fan Tutte" ("Thus Do They All"), "Le Nozze Di Figaro" ("The Marriage of Figaro") and "Die entführung aus dem Serial" ("The Abduction From the Seraglio") by W.A. Mozart; "Der Freischutz" ("The Freeshooter") by C.M. von Weber; and "Fra Diavolo" by Auber. The performance will begin with arias and continue with exciting scenes.

"Hine e Hine"; and the lush eight-part arrangement of the American folk song "Shenandoah."

Further selections include "Nox Arumque" by Eric Whitacre; "The Curse Upon Iron" by Estonian composer Veljo Tormis for 16-part chorus and shaman drum, featuring tenor **Christopher Delgado** and bass **David Kincaid**; and the gorgeous "Amor De Mi Alma" (You Are the Love of My Soul) by Z. Randall Stroupe. The program will conclude with "The Battle of Jericho" by Moses Hogan.

Grammy-nominated saxophonist, bandleader, record producer and composer Ravi Coltrane will appear as part of the FSU Cultural Events Series

program, LIVE! at StarScape, on **Saturday, April 21**, at 8 p.m. in Lane Manicur Hall.

Coltrane has created a first-class reputation within the jazz community. The son of legendary saxophonist John Coltrane and pianist Alice Coltrane, he has worked alongside jazz and pop icons, including McCoy Tyner, Carlos Santana, Herbie Hancock and Chick Corea, as well as contemporaries Branford Marsalis, Kenny Barron and

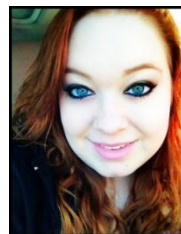
Joe Lovano. His longtime quartet includes pianist Luis Perdomo, bassist Drew Gress and drummer E.J. Strickland. Led by Coltrane's scorching saxophone, they have set themselves apart as one of the most electrifying groups performing on the current jazz scene, offering a signature sound guaranteed to delight listeners.

Community members will have the opportunity to meet Coltrane during a free interactive session presented as part of CES' educational program, Arts for Enrichment. The session, during which Coltrane will discuss his career in the music industry, will begin at 4:30 p.m. in Lane Manicur Hall.

Huyser to Present Junior Soprano Recital



FSU student **Lauren Huyser** will present her junior soprano vocal recital, accompanied by pianist Judith Brown, on **April 21** at 8 p.m.

Huyser will perform three songs from Vincenzo Bellini's "Sei Ariette" ("Six Ariettas"). "Malinconia, Ninfa Gentile" ("Melancholy, Gentle Nymph"), the first of the six, expresses devotion to the nymph, "Melancholy." The third in the set, "Bella Nice Che D'Amore" ("Beautiful Nice, That I Love"), is a poem about a lover who longs for death. The last arietta, "Ma Rendi pur Contento" ("But While You Make Me Happy"), expresses the innocence of a lover who only cares for the happiness of his lady. Her program also includes works by Francesco Durante, Claudio Monteverdi, Alessandro Parisotti, Reynaldo Hahn, Franz Schubert, Aaron Copland and Richard Hageman. Huyser will close out her performance by singing the solemn piece, "The K'e." This piece uses an English translation of the ancient Chinese text, which tells of a woman who falls in love with a man and promises to run away with him.

A Story of Courage



Dewey Bozella will come to FSU to share his story of perseverance and faith on **Tuesday, April 10**, at 7 p.m. in Lane Manicur Hall.

Bozella was a 24-year old amateur boxer when he was convicted of a murder he did not commit. With the help of the Innocence Project, Bozella was exonerated in 2009 after 26 years in prison, earned ESPN's 2011 Arthur Ashe Courage Award and recently won his first and only professional boxing match at 52 years old. Bozella has also established the Dewey Bozella Foundation, working with kids to teach them discipline and the value of hard work and courage through boxing.

FSU will be the site of the second annual Western Maryland Science and Engineering Festival on **Saturday, April 21**, from 10 a.m. to 2 p.m. The event will be held on the Upper Quad of the FSU campus, and demonstrations will also take place at the University of Maryland Center for Environmental Science Appalachian Laboratory in Frostburg. A shuttle will be available to transport individuals between the two sites.

The event is open to K-12 students in public or private schools and their parents. There will be numerous hands-on activities, including forensics, origami and math, build a bat, geocaching, chemistry experiments and a critter corner. Students can also participate in the challenge events of egg drop, catapult and paper airplane design. The local festival is an official satellite event of the USA Science and Engineering Festival being held the next weekend in Washington, D.C. The Allegany County festival is being organized by FSU, Allegany County Public Schools and UMCES Appalachian Lab.

FSU Doing Economic Impact Study

Over the next two weeks, FSU will launch a comprehensive economic impact study as part of its efforts to uphold goals that comprise the University's Strategic Plan. This is the first comprehensive attempt of its kind undertaken by the University.

A randomly selected sample of faculty, staff and students will receive a survey regarding their expenditure patterns in various categories over the last year. Recipients are urged to respond accurately and completely so impact measurements can approximate actual experience. Participants will have until **May 11** to complete the survey. Specific instructions for each

distinct group will accompany each survey.

Note that information participants provide is completely confidential; only aggregated information will be reported on completion of the study sometime in early fall of this year.

She has a doctorate in counseling and personnel services from the University of Maryland, College Park, and a master's degree in human resources and behavioral management from Johns Hopkins University. She was the recipient of the 2010-2011 Outstanding Research in Developmental Education from the Maryland state affiliate of the National Association of Developmental Education.
