Screenings, Lecture on Locally Filmed 'A Lesson of Love' Set at FSU

Professor **Micheal McAlexander**, an assistant professor in FSU's Department of Mass Communication, will present a lecture about his experiences with writing, directing and editing the feature film, "A Lesson of Love," on **Thursday, Feb. 16**, at 6 p.m. in Lane University Center 111. Screenings of the film will be held at 4 and 7 p.m.

"A Lesson of Love" features many familiar faces, including those of FSU President Jonathan Gibraltar and his wife, Laurie. It was filmed in and around Frostburg and will feature many local sights. In the film, a professor moves from a big city to teach in a small town college where he falls in love with a local religious woman, but his dedication to reason and her profound spirituality clash. To be together, they must overcome their obstacles.

At the beginning of his career, McAlexander held several entertainment positions in Hollywood,



including segment producer, assistant to the producer, writer/editor and band manager. While in graduate school at the University of Southern California's School of Cinematic Arts, he was awarded a Paramount Screenwriting Fellowship and a CINE Golden Eagle award for cinematography and editing on a short film. On completion of his Master of Fine Arts degree, McAlexander worked as director of Outreach Services for USC's Entertainment Technology Center. While there, he produced and directed a live, televised, multi-city

technology demonstration viewed by numerous Hollywood executives. McAlexander later worked as director of Special Projects at ASI Entertainment and was involved in research projects with companies such as CBS, Warner Bros, Paramount Pictures and Seagate Technologies. Before coming to FSU, McAlexander taught as an adjunct professor in the entertainment studies program at California State University, Fullerton, and currently is a visiting professor at the Institute for International Studies at Ramkhamhaeng University in Bangkok, Thailand.

During the lecture, McAlexander will discuss the process of making a movie on virtually no budget as well as the creative aspects and difficulties of being writer, director and editor on one project. "House of Sand" offers a hypnotic meditation on matriarchy, survival and the acceptance of life's inexplicable twists. Set in the surreal desert landscape of Lençóis Maranhenses

National Park on the northern coast of Brazil, this visually breathtaking film follows three generations of women as they struggle with their isolated existence. "House of Sand" lacks a narrative and instead focuses on the metaphoric relationship between the landscape, time and the three women. The film builds to a quiet understanding of what life offers (and fails to offer) and how we adapt. It also provides a feminist perspective in which men keep upsetting nature's balance through war, scientific exploration or adventure and women find a way to make sense of it.

spectacular theatrical magic production and takes his audience on a journey filled with dramatic illusions,

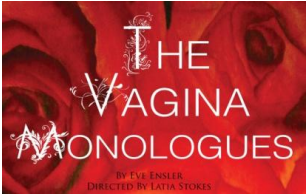

Imagine overhearing Pablo Picasso and Albert Einstein debate the art of physics and the physics of art. That’s exactly what happens at the Lapin Agile (Nimble Rabbit) when, in Paris, 1904, these two young geniuses engage in a playful conversation on the eve of their greatest accomplishments – Picasso’s shift from his blue to cubist period and Einstein’s publishing of his special theory of relativity. “Picasso at the Lapin Agile” is a witty romp that also gives audiences much to chew on about the significance of art and science in the 20th century, as well as the thrill of being on the verge of something significant.

Performances by FSU’s Department of Theatre and Dance will take place **March 2, 3, 8, 9 and 10** at 7:30 p.m., with a matinee performance **March 3** at 2 p.m. in PAC’s F. Perry Smith Studio Theatre.

Cook to Perform Bass/Baritone Recital

FSU senior **Nathan Cook** will present his senior bass/baritone vocal recital, accompanied by pianist Laura Godfrey, on **Sunday, Feb. 19**, at 3 p.m.

Cook will perform three works by Brahms, beginning with “Auf dem Kirchhofe” (“At the Cemetery”) in which the piano plays furious arpeggios and thick chords to portray a storm taking place above the churchyard. Cook will also be performing pieces by Scarlatti, Carissimi, Caccini, Rossini, Strauss, Quilter and Vaughn Williams.

Social Satire Exhibit

The INX Graphic Social Satire exhibit, a collection of editorial cartoon art, will be at the Stephanie Ann Roper Gallery **through Sunday, Feb. 26**.

The INX group was formed by New York Times editorial illustrators during the time of President Reagan. The name “INX” was coined by a play on the essential medium employed by these pen and brush artists. They all shared a desire to produce and distribute uncensored political images to news marketplaces, essentially keeping editorial control in the hands of the creators.

Since 1980, the INX group has produced compelling visual commentary on the big events that

have spanned the millennial divide. The group became self-syndicated once more in 2002, this time employing the Internet by allowing subscribers to download the work directly from their website: inxart.com.

The Roper Gallery in the Fine Arts building is open Sundays through Wednesdays from 1 to 4 p.m. The exhibit is free and open to the public.

‘Blinded in Batesburg: Learning of a Hometown Atrocity’



Andy Duncan, a faculty member in the FSU Department of English, will present “Blinded in Batesburg: Learning of a Hometown Atrocity” at 7 p.m. on

Monday, Feb. 13, in the Lane Atkinson Room (232), as part of the campus Faculty Lecture Series. The event is free and open to the public.

On Feb. 13, 1946, an African-American World War II veteran named Isaac Woodard, Jr., was pulled off a Greyhound bus in Batesburg, S.C., only hours after his honorable discharge, and was beaten by the local police chief, Lynwood Shull. As a result of his injuries, Woodard was blinded for life. The incident became a national scandal and landmark federal civil rights case.

Duncan, a Batesburg native, was never told of this incident by his family. It was not until he was nearly 40 that he read about the incident in the Library of America Anthology Reporting Civil Rights.

In this lecture series, which will be held on the 66th anniversary of the beating as well as in honor of Black History Month, Duncan will discuss the facts of the Woodard case; its ramifications in politics, law and popular cultures; and its effects on his family, his upbringing and his career. An audience discussion will follow.

Duncan, an assistant professor, teaches writing classes at FSU, including journalism, fiction and advanced composition. He has been a journalist for 30 years, both writing and editing, in feature news, for newspapers and magazines, in print and online. He has also been a published fiction writer for 15 years.
