Scholarship Recognizes Value of Veterans, Leadership

Sometimes the act of leadership can be as simple as asking people about their lives and taking time to listen. That was one of the things *Dr. Evan Offstein* noticed – and appreciated – about *Del Perdew* after he joined FSU's College of Business as a new professor in the Department of Management in 2004. He got to know Perdew, an FSU alumnus, through Perdew's work in providing IT support for the College.

"Del was one of the first people I met when I came here and for whatever reason, he and I connected over sports and became friends. He took an interest in my daughters, who are both athletes. ... He was the guy always asking about my kids and how I was liking Frostburg. I never forgot that."

Perdew and Offstein also shared another bond – both were U.S. Army veterans. Offstein, a West Point Academy alumnus and noted scholar and author, often draws upon his experiences in the military in his writing and work with leadership.

A long-time supporter of all things Frostburg, Perdew became ill, eventually passing away in 2011. In recognition of their connection as friends and veterans, Offstein established the Dr. Evan H. Offstein and Del Perdew Leadership Scholarship. To be eligible for the scholarship, applicants must be active military and/or veterans enrolled full time in the College of Business, have an overall grade point average of 3.25 and possess leadership potential, as demonstrated by past experiences.

The scholarship also helps uphold another goal – supporting the College of Business' commitment to produce leaders.

"Leaders come in all shapes and sizes. You don't have to be a West Point graduate; you don't have to have a Ph.D. Del really struck me in that regard. At its atomic unit, leadership is about impacting people. Del is certainly one of the reasons I stayed at Frostburg, and he had an impact on me," Offstein said.

Basket Symposium and Exhibit to Feature the McCrobies of Garrett County



A symposium and exhibit on the art and craft of Garrett County basket maker James McCrobie, Sr., will be held on **Saturday**, **April 5**, from 1 to 3 p.m. at MCTA at 25 E. Main St. in Frostburg. Hosted by Mountain City Traditional Arts and the Center for Research in Basketry, Inc. (CRB), the symposium will launch an exhibit of McCrobie baskets, which will continue **through April 11**. Come hear treasured McCrobie family stories highlighting a basket maker and his family who made and sold baskets to support themselves during the Depression.

The event is the result of research by Dr. Kathleen Beauchesne of CRB and FSU "Folklore in Appalachia" students who identified and recorded basket craftsmanship throughout Western Maryland and the entire

state. *Dr. Kara Rogers Thomas*, an associate professor in the Department of Sociology at FSU, and Beauchesne will speak about the work of these FSU students and the research done for the basketry project, Woven Traditions: Maryland Basket Making Culture and Communities, Past and Present. Symposium speakers will also include Dr. Charles Camp, who interviewed McCrobie and his family during the 1970s for the Smithsonian; McCrobie's son, the last of six generations of basket makers; and Richard Yoder, curator of the Springs Museum in Springs, Pa., and McCrobie basket collector.

Office for Civil Rights to Conduct Focus Groups April 8 and 9

Campus sexual violence is an important issue that FSU takes very seriously. The U.S. Department of Education's Office for Civil Rights (OCR) is reviewing the University's policies and practices related to Title IX of the Education Amendment Acts of 1972, which is the federal law that prohibits sexual harassment and sexual violence.

Representatives from OCR will be on campus on **Tuesday**, **April 8**, and **Wednesday**, **April 9**, to conduct focus group sessions with the campus community on issues related to sexual harassment and sexual violence. OCR will also be available to speak privately with anyone regarding these issues, or to anyone who is a survivor of sexual violence or sexual harassment.

All sessions will be held in Lane 111. The schedule of the focus groups on **April 8** is: 10 a.m. – resident assistants; 11 a.m. – FSU staff; 1 p.m. – FSU faculty; 2 p.m. – Student Government Association and campus leaders; 3 p.m. – Staff, faculty and students participating in FSU organizations that address issues of importance to women; and 4 p.m. – individual meetings with OCR. **Note that you can call an OCR representative at one of the numbers below to schedule a private meeting. Walk-ins are also welcome.** The schedule for **April 9** is: 10 a.m. – student-athletes, 11 a.m. – members of fraternities, 1 p.m. – members of sororities and 2 p.m. – individual meetings with OCR.

OCR has asked the University to inform individuals attending focus groups and meetings that it keeps records of its contacts, which are considered public records and are therefore subject to public disclosure laws, but any identifying information in these records is redacted or removed before release.
