I want to reinforce that message by encouraging you to be aware of your surroundings and avoid gatherings where there are large groups of people who may be unknown to you and/or illegal activities are occurring, including underage drinking and drug use. If you ever feel there is a possibility of danger, please know you can anonymously make a report to campus police. While we live in Western Maryland, our environment is not immune to the violence we have seen in other localities.
